FROM THE

PASTOR'S DESK

**Enough Time** 

One of the biggest complaints these days is the lack of time. We just don't have enough time to do all that we want to do, or even all we have to do. A New York Times article described "a swelling complaint of people all over the United States, in large cities or small, with highly demanding jobs or no job at all. Almost nobody, it seems, has enough time."

Along with what we want to do at church, there are practices or away games we take our children or grandchildren to, there are friendships to keep up, there are the demands of caring for those older than us (parents, aunts/uncles, older siblings) while also caring for those who are younger (children, grandchildren, younger siblings). There are business demands, school demands, neighborhood demands, exercise and self-care demands, and even free time demands.

Lent is upon us, however, and this is the season that particularly asks us to slow down or even stop some things or activities in order for us to focus on our relationship with God. It asks us to intentionally set aside something (give something up) in order to make time for God.

What we choose to set aside for these 40 days is up to each of us to decide, but we're asked to enjoy a little Sabbath time with God. "In the Sabbath," wrote one commentator, "God reminds us that our identity comes from him instead of from the things we produce or consume." It's a time "to find new energy by celebrating the God of love in our midst." Sabbath time can be Sunday, or it can be any time we set aside to spend with God.

So. Lent is not to be a dour and downer time, but to be a chance to renew or deepen our relationship with our Lord, and to celebrate that relationship. We don't give up something for Lent for its own sake, we do so to be more in touch with the God who gave his life for us.

This Lent let's arrange our schedules to include a bit more time in relationship with God—whether that be some time each day in prayer, reading a passage from the Bible, doing an online devotion (www.d365.org is a good one to use) or making sure we get to church on Sunday to hear his word opened up to us.

I pray you'll have enough time this Lenten season to focus on your own relationship with our loving Lord. gefferson L. Hatch



## RECIPE OF THE MONTH

#### BEEF POTPIES WITH CHEDDAR-STOUT CRUST

#### **INGREDIENTS**

#### For the dough:

1 3/4 cups all-purpose flour, plus more for dusting 3/4 teaspoon fine salt

1 stick cold unsalted butter, cut into 1/2-inch pieces

3/4 cup grated Irish cheddar cheese (about 3 ounces)

6 to 7 tablespoons stout beer

1 large egg, lightly beaten

#### For the Filling:

2 1/4 pounds beef chuck roast, cut into 1-inch pieces

1/4 cup all-purpose flour

Kosher salt and freshly ground pepper

3 tablespoons unsalted butter

1/3 cup stout beer

3 medium leeks, white and light green parts only, halved lengthwise and cut into 1-inch pieces

1 pound carrots, cut into 1-inch pieces

2 stalks celery, cut into 1-inch pieces

#### **Directions:**

- 1.Make the dough: Pulse the flour and fine salt in a food processor to combine. Add the butter and cheese and pulse until the mixture looks like coarse meal with some pea-size bits of butter. Drizzle in 6 tablespoons beer and pulse to combine. Squeeze the dough between your fingers; if it does not hold its shape, pulse in up to 1 more tablespoon beer. Pat the dough into a disk, wrap in plastic wrap and refrigerate until firm, at least 1 hour or overnight.
- 2. Meanwhile, make the filling: Preheat the oven to 325 degrees. Toss the beef, flour, 1 1/4 teaspoons kosher salt, and pepper to taste in a large bowl. Melt the butter in a Dutch oven or large ovenproof pot over medium-high heat. Add the beef and cook, stirring occasionally, until browned all over, about 7 minutes. Add the beer and 2 cups water, scraping up any browned bits from the bottom of the pot. Bring to a simmer, then cover, transfer to the oven and braise, 30 minutes. Add the leeks, carrots and celery to the pot and continue braising, 1 more hour.
- 3. Meanwhile, put six 10-ounce ramekins on a parchment-lined baking sheet. Roll out the dough between 2 lightly floured sheets of parchment into a 10-by-15-inch rectangle; cut into six 5-inch squares. Make a few slits in the middle of each square to let steam escape. Remove the filling from the oven and increase the temperature to 375 degrees. Season the filling with salt and pepper and divide among the ramekins (there may be some filling left over). Top each with a square of dough, pressing the edges into the ramekin. Brush with the beaten egg. Bake until the crust is crisp and golden brown, 35 to 40 minutes. Let rest about 10 minutes before serving.
