FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

LATEST UPDATE



So, what's the latest on the church re-opening? Our Reentry Team (myself, Joanne Lawson and Cathy Bambrick) got word from an online meeting with our Presbytery's Reentry Team 2 weeks ago. They have been in touch with the NJ Governor's office, and with our denomination's HQ, and

they gave us the latest scoop. We're currently in Phase 2, which means a few things are different from Phase 1, which is where we were last month. But as of this writing (early July) the virus is making a comeback amongst the population, and some states are rolling back their relaxation of the rules. Restaurants were supposed to be open for in-house seating as of this week in NJ and that has been rescinded for now and the latest stats are that the virus is rising again in our county.

Based on the above information our Presbytery Reentry Team has determined that in-church gatherings *may* take place with up to 100 people (or 25% maximum capacity), *but* there are restrictions on how folks may interact while they do. Whether indoors or outdoors, the following restrictions must be observed:

- Everyone must wear a mask
- No hymns may be sung (congregational singing or saying is a super-spreader), so no collective readings may take place (which then would include Call to Worship, Prayer of Confession, Responsive Reading, the Lord's Prayer)
- No hymnals, Bibles, or bulletins may be used
- Social distancing must still take place (which restricts us to 14 locations in our sanctuary where people may sit—totaling 14-50 worshipers)
- No passing collection plates or handshaking and no Coffee Hour before or after the service
- Livestreaming of the worship should continue for those who can't attend or are not comfortable doing so
- Bathrooms are not to be used
- A plan for cleaning before and after worship should be in place, along with offering masks to any who don't have one, and a plan made for how to deal with anyone who doesn't want to go along with the restrictions
- A list of attendees should be kept in case contact tracing is needed later
- A plan must be passed by the church board (our Session) unanimously covering all of these considerations, and
- That plan must be submitted to the Presbytery Board of Trustees for approval.

Comparing a worship service with all of those restrictions in place to a full worship service with 10 or less without restrictions - our leadership has determined that we prefer the full service. The thought of a worship service without singing, reading outloud, responses, and corporately-said prayers sounds much less satisfying than getting the full service in our homes.

Please do, though, contact the church office (Laura) and let her know if you'd like to attend a service in person. We are allowed up to 10 without all of the above restrictions (other than social distancing) and she'd be happy to schedule you in for a Sunday that allows for that (after accounting for pastor, organist, video person and special music).

Our prayer is that a vaccine will be discovered soon that allows us to leave the restrictions behind, but in the meantime we continue to be the church of Jesus Christ as best we can, which is all God requires of us.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

FROZEN MARGARITA PIE

INGREDIENTS:

6 Tbsp. unsalted butter

10 graham crackers

3 Tbsp. sugar

1/2 tsp. kosher salt, divided

3/4 cup chilled heavy cream

4 limes, halved

1 (14-oz.) can sweetened condensed milk

3 Tbsp. tequila blanco

PREPARATION

- 1. Melt butter in a small saucepan over medium heat. Let cool slightly.
- 2. Crumble graham crackers into a food processor. Add melted butter, sugar, and 1/4 tsp. salt and process until mixture resembles wet sand. Transfer mixture to a shallow 9"-diameter pie dish. Using the bottom of a measuring cup, press crust firmly and evenly across bottom and up sides of dish. Freeze 20 minutes.
- 3. Meanwhile, whisk cream in a medium bowl until stiff peaks form, about 4 minutes.
- 4. Finely grate zest from 1 lime half into a small bowl; set aside. Squeeze juice from all of the limes into a fine-mesh sieve set over a glass measuring cup (you should have about 1/2 cup juice).
- 5. Pour lime juice into another medium bowl. Add condensed milk, tequila, and remaining 1/4 tsp. salt and whisk until mixture is smooth. Gently fold in half of the whipped cream just to combine, then add the remaining whipped cream and gently fold until no streaks remain (be careful not to overmix; you want to keep as much air in the whipped cream as possible).
- 6. Remove pie dish from the freezer and scrape filling into crust. Use a spoon to gently spread filling evenly all the way to the edges. Sprinkle with reserved lime zest and freeze until filling is set, at least 8 hours.

Do Ahead: Pie can be made 3 days ahead. Cover; keep chilled. Let soften in fridge 30 minutes before slicing. Enjoy!
