FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

### **Something to Roar About**



Happy New Year! Happy New Decade! But other than the number of the year, is anything really new?

On a surface level, there are always new things happening around us. Here in Branchville, the Grill next door to the church is once again open under new management. During this past year we welcomed some new members into our church and it changes the dynamic (for the better) of who we are. New stores open here and there, a new neighbour moves onto your street, someone in your family gets married, a baby is born to a relative, and newness is all around us if we but have eyes to see it.

Paul explains in II Corinthians 5:7—"So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!"

Just as a new year gives us a clean slate of 12 months ahead of us to try and do things new and in a better way, living in Christ gives us an even cleaner slate. Our sins have been wiped away. That means the mean things we've uncharacteristically said to someone are now forgiven. The good we meant to do and didn't, or the nastiness we let out but shouldn't have—has been forgiven and put behind us.

Didn't we just hear that at Christmas? "And you shall name him Jesus, for he shall save his people from their sins." Saved from sin in this case means forgiven. How, in this new year (and new decade), can we respond appropriately to such a thing? C.S. Lewis says that forgiveness and forgiving are two sides of the same coin. In <u>Letters to Malcolm</u> he writes, "By heavenly standards forgiving and being forgiven are two names for the same thing. ... No evil habit is so ingrained nor so long prayed against... that it cannot, even in old age, be whisked away."

So this new year, why don't we try a little harder to forgive others? It's not really that hard to do, but can also be a blessing to us for not holding the grudge that eats away at us like a cancer, and opens us to the forgiveness we truly need as well. "Forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors" we say each week as a part of the Lord's Prayer. To receive it we must give it to others, so let's add a renewed emphasis on being forgiving of others this coming year and decade. Now that's something to roar about in the 20s!

# REGIPE OF THE MONTH

#### **RUSTIC ITALIAN TORTELLINI SOUP**

#### **INGREDIENTS**

3/4 pound Sweet Italian sausage links, casings removed

1 medium onion, chopped

6 garlic cloves, minced

2 cans (14-1/2 ounces each) chicken broth

1-3/4 cups chicken stock

1 can (14-1/2 ounces) diced tomatoes, undrained

1 package (9 ounces) refrigerated cheese tortellini

1 can 14 ounce cannellini beans

1 package (6 ounces) fresh baby spinach,

coarsely chopped

2-1/4 teaspoons minced fresh basil

1/4 teaspoon pepper

Dash crushed red pepper flakes

Shredded Parmesan cheese, optional



#### **DIRECTIONS**

Crumble sausage into a Dutch oven; add onion. Cook and stir over medium heat until meat is no longer pink. Add garlic; cook 1 minute longer. Stir in the chicken stock, broth, cannellini beans and tomatoes. Bring to a boil. Add tortellini; return to a boil. Cook for 5-8 minutes or until almost tender, stirring occasionally. Reduce heat; add the spinach, basil, pepper and pepper flakes. Cook 2-3 minutes longer or until spinach is wilted and tortellini are tender. Serve with cheese if desired. Enjoy!
