

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Still the Church



When did the whole virus situation become real to you? For me it happened very quickly. Just 3 weeks ago on a Monday (3/9) we had a Session meeting where we discussed taking precautions during worship, like not passing the collection plate (but having it in the back for folks to drop in their

offering), or not offering the Greeting, and we took the precautions very lightly, taking no official action. By Thursday, though, I had an email out to the elders asking again that we could take some very definite steps, and by the next day we had cancelled worship in the building altogether. Within the span of 4 days we went from joshing about taking precautions to closing our doors.

It was then that it became very real to me. We scrambled to figure out how to do Facebook Live, and after watching about 15 YouTube videos on how to do it, by Saturday had a procedure down. With just three of us we were able to stream a complete worship live from the sanctuary using Facebook, and then save the recording to post later on YouTube. Hectic days, for sure, but very satisfying ones that we were able to figure out how to cobble together enough technology to make it work.

And then something magical happened. We got word from members far and wide that they were able to participate in the service. We heard from members and previous members in Florida, New York City, Oklahoma, California, Michigan and other locales that they had connected to the service and were heartened to be a part of it. Folks commented throughout the service, "saw" each other online and felt connected to each other again. By the second week we had more watching online than would normally attend worship in person.

It's been just three weeks, but I think we have this whole procedure down. I was worried that folks would have a hard time connecting, and indeed a few have had technical difficulties, but it has gone a lot more smoothly than I'd ever dreamed it might. I've had (my own) family tune in from south Jersey and from North Carolina. I got an email from the brother of a member in MD who said when the quarantine has been lifted he'll be going back to his regular church but in the meantime he'll be a loyal online member tuning in to our service every week. I've heard from so many that they are grateful to be able, in these times of social distancing, to see a regular worship service, hear some beautiful organ music, and hear the Word preached.

What's happening in the world is an awful, terrible thing. Folks are dying in isolation, cut off from their families, and no one knows how long this whole lock-down is going to last. But in the midst of it we are still the church, the body of Christ, and are still finding a way to be together as a family of faith. And our family has grown in some ways, which is a blessing to each of us. So may the Lord help us through safely; may we each be cautious and extra careful to not expose ourselves to this raging virus; and may we be back together soon in-person. When that happens I think we'll all be able to acknowledge and better appreciate what a blessing it is to just <u>be</u> together. In the meantime, we'll continue to meet online and continue to be the church family we love and appreciate.


CLOSINGS AND SCHEDULE CHANGES:

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

NONNA'S PASTICCIOTTI

For the Dough:

2 cups all-purpose flour

1/2 cup sugar

1 egg

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Pinch of salt

1 teaspoon baking powder

1/4 cup butter

1/4 cup shortening

1/4 cup milk

For the Filling:

3 tablespoons cornstarch

1/2 cup sugar

1/2 cup heavy cream

1 cup milk

2 egg yolks

1 tablespoon butter

1 teaspoon almond extract

1 egg, beaten, for the egg wash



Custard Directions: Sift the cornstarch and sugar then put in a saucepan. Add the milk and heavy cream and whisk lightly until you obtain a smooth mixture. Whisk in the egg, then heat on medium until custard thickens.

Mix in the butter and almond extract. Remove from heat and cover custard with plastic wrap to prevent a skin from forming while it cools.

Pastry Directions: In a food processor add the flour, sugar, salt and baking powder. Pulse until all mixed. Add the butter and shortening then pulse until mixture looks like crumbly cornmeal. Add egg, milk and vanilla and mix until dough starts to form a ball. Turn out dough onto a board and lightly work dough until it's smooth.

Divide dough into two flattened rounds, cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate for 1 hour. Starting with the first piece of dough, place it onto a floured board. Roll it out to 1/4" thick. Using a 3 inch pastry cutter or glass, cut out 12 rounds. Place each round into the muffin pan and press into mold to remove all air. Add about 2 tablespoons of the custard to each of the molds. Cover each with a 3" round of dough. Let chill in refrigerator for an hour or overnight. Brush tops with egg wash, then bake at 425° for 15-18 minutes.
