FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Unity Doesn't Mean Uniformity



A General Assembly Report from our denomination a few years back said this:

"...it is self-evident that people tend to prefer the understanding of Jesus Christ which gives expression to their own experience. This is only natural. The problem arises when one group of people assumes its experience to be the only valid experience, exalting and universalizing its own expression of faith. Such exclusivity not only denigrates the faith of others; it also shuts off valid challenges and enrichments which may come from others."

(From the PCUSA report to General Assembly "Is Christ Divided?")

What makes this such a timely quote for me is if you were to substitute "politics" for both "Jesus Christ" and for "faith" in the above paragraph. That's what our country seems to have done recently. We hear about the division in our country, and wonder how it got to be as bad as it is. Presidential politicians aside, the bigger question is whether our country can move past this election and still claim to be the *United* States of America?

I believe we can, and that we Christians should lead the way. Whatever the outcome of the election is (and this is being written the day before the election), I believe that we each have a part to play in helping our nation heal. Whichever party wins and whichever loses, I hope there will be consideration for the other side, and a recognition that both parties have plusses that make our nation stronger. What part can each of us play in bringing about greater understanding? When others around us gloat or moan at the outcome, we as Christ's representatives can speak words of hope, of comfort, and of unity as Americans amidst our diverse political viewpoints.

Our denomination began with historic principles written back in 1788 that included this: "Therefore, we consider the rights of private judgment, in all matters that respect religion, as universal and unalienable". Just as it is in our DNA as Presbyterians to respect each others' opinions about religion, let us do so regarding others' politics. This is an amazing country, and I believe we each have a duty as citizens and as Christians to do our best to promote unity, rather than pushing for uniformity, for in our diversity lies our strength.

# RECIPE OF THE MONTH

### **BLUE CHEESE/THYME POPOVERS**

### **INGREDIENTS:**

2 Large eggs

2 Tbs. unsalted butter, melted

1/2 tsp. salt

3 oz. blue cheese (or cheese of choice)

1 cup whole milk

1 cup flour

1/8 tsp. pepper

1 Tbs. finely chopped thyme



### **DIRECTIONS:**

- 1. In a large bowl, whisk together eggs, milk, melted butter, flour, salt and pepper. Whisk until lumps have disappeared. Whisk in cheese and thyme.
- 2. Cover and chill batter in airtight container for at least 2 hours or up to 24 hours in refrigerator.
- 3. Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Generously butter mini muffin tins. Fill each cup up to the top with the chilled batter.
- 4. Bake popovers until golden and puffed, 15 to 20 minutes. Serve immediately. Enjoy!
