FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

### Where Are We At?



Where are we at in terms of re-opening our sanctuary for worship this fall? Good question! If only the virus would settle down and stop mutating we'd have a more solid answer for you. The Session met last month and decided to continue our outdoor worship for the month of September so that we all stay as safe as possible.

Here are a number of factors that we will need to weigh in the weeks ahead:

- The CDC recommends wearing masks inside while this Delta variant is still ravaging our country.
- Our Presbytery recommends that we wear masks inside during indoor worship, or worship outdoors.
- As fall happens we won't be able to be outside for much longer.
- The Delta variant is transmissible to those who are fully vaccinated.
- Someone who attended our worship services regularly before the pandemic is fully vaccinated, but contracted Covid-19 anyway. His symptoms were mild, but quarantined for 10 days and didn't pass it along to anyone else. He said he knows of many others who have also contracted it despite being fully vaccinated.
- Children are now more susceptible to this new variant, and children under 12 have not been approved to receive the vaccination yet.
- Members of our church bring their children to worship, so we need to protect them as much as possible.
- I spoke to my GP doctor who said if you have anyone who is immunocompromised in your church, including children who haven't been or can't be vaccinated, those with diabetes, anyone fighting cancer, etc., then everyone should be wearing a mask around them indoors (other than worship leaders if they're at least 10 feet away from the closest worshiper).
- We've learned that it's okay now to sing with your mask on.

Information continues to come in scientifically-based on studies which has changed what we know now from when this virus first appeared. Recommendations have changed over the past year and a half because we're learning more each day, so we as a caring church must continue to adapt. We thought we were headed into a fully open church program by this fall, but this setback is both disappointing and an ongoing challenge. We will do our best to keep everyone safe while still offering worship and programs that are as full as possible. We've made it this far, let's hang tough as we continue to be Christ's body in this place for each other and for those in need.



# RECIPE OF THE MONTH

### SHEET PAN SHRIMP FRIED RICE

### **INGREDIENTS:**

4 cups cooked white rice

5 scallions, thinly sliced

2 scallions, dark green parts sliced thinly

2 large carrots, peeled and grated

3/4 cups frozen peas, thawed

2 garlic cloves, finely grated

1 Tbs. fresh ginger, finely grated

1/4 cup vegetable oil

1/4 cup soy sauce

3 Tbs. seasoned rice wine vinegar

1 Tbs. sesame oil

3 large eggs, beaten

1lb. Medium shrimp, peeled & deveined

Toasted sesame seeds and sriracha, for serving.

### **DIRECTIONS:**

- 1. Preheat oven to 475 degrees F.
- 2. Toss together the rice, sliced scallions, carrots, peas, garlic, ginger, vegetable oil, soy sauce, vinegar and sesame oil in a large bowl until the rice is completely coated. Spread on a sheet pan and bake until the rice begins to toast on the outer edges, about 15 minutes. Toss the rice on the sheet pan using a metal spatula, scraping up any stuck-on pieces. Drizzle the eggs over the rice and nestle in the shrimp. Continue baking until the shrimp and eggs are cooked through, 5 to 10 minutes more. Top with the toasted sesame seeds and reserved dark green scallions and divide among 4 plates. Serve with sriracha on the side.
- 3. Enjoy!
